Resolution 2020-13 Establishing Rules for Tele-Meeting.

Motion made by Laura Baker to adopt Res 2020-13 as presented; 2nd by Frank Anderson; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

Resolution 2020-14 Amending Tax Collection for COVID crisis.

Motion made by Frank Anderson to adopt Res 2020-14 as presented; 2nd by Laura Baker; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

Resolution 2020-15 Amending Addresses for 161 E. King Street.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Review of minutes from meeting held March 19, 2020.

Motion made by Dan Watkins to accept the minutes of March 19, 2020; 2nd by Frank Anderson; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

REPORTS:

TREASURER:

Council reviewed the financial documents and prepared bills; Mr. Bolton answered questions concerning specifics. A bank audit was also presented, which was thoroughly reviewed by Mrs. Baker.

Motion made by Frank Anderson to accept the Treasurer's Report thru 3/31/2020; 2nd by Dan Watkins; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

Approval of Expenditures:

Motion made by Dan Watkins to approve paying the bills as presented; 2nd by Frank Anderson; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

Investment of Liquid Fuels funds with PLGIT: LF Funds were received as budgeted from PennDOT. PLGIT has offered several options for a short 6 month investment (to realize gains by end of year). Treasurer is recommending an investment of \$70K for six months in the PRIME fund.

Motion made by Frank Anderson to authorize Mr. Bolton to invest LF funds with PLGIT as recommended; 2nd by Dan Watkins; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

ADMINISTRATIVE: David Bolton, MBA, CBO updated Council on the following activity:

- ⇒ Reports have been submitted directly to Council on the activities of the past month. Mr. Bolton has been working from home and frequenting the office when needed while the office is closed to the public.
- ⇒ Attended the bid opening on Tues., April 14th with Eng. John Golanoski to act as witness for the borough.
- ⇒ Mr. Bolton has explored options for street sweeping services this year. Conewago Twp Maintenance Manager Scott Small has a sweeper that can also vacuum out the wastewater collection bins (others did not). Council should authorize Mr. Bolton to work with Conewago Twp for these needs, not to exceed \$1,500.

Motion made by Frank Anderson to authorize Mr. Bolton to work with Conewago Twp for street

sweeping and vacuum needs in the borough at set dollar amount; 2nd by Laura Baker; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

⇒ Solid waste collection agreement with Waste Connections ends March 30, 2021. Provision for a one-year extension in agreement. Mr. Bolton recommends doing so as this was a joint bid through the county and WC has been very accommodating to needs.

Motion made by Laura Baker to authorize to submit agreement for extension of solid waste services with Waste Connections through March 30, 2022; 2nd by Dan Watkins; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

SOLICITOR: Tim Shultis

⇒ Borough and Mr. Bolton have received subpoenas for the Platt v Graham, et al case in New Oxford borough. Mr. Shultis suggests the borough retain Michael Crotty as special counsel, who represented us in the Platt v Abbottstown Borough case, since he is aware of the background of the cases.

Motion made by Frank Anderson to retain Michael Crotty as special counsel; 2nd by Dan Watkins; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

⇒ Updates on the agreements between Berwick and Abbottstown on Kinneman Rd project. Minutes from March 4th meeting have been reviewed (were previously accepted pending review by solicitor). Berwick will pay the bills associated with the project and invoice the borough for our agreed share of the costs, to include a small management fee. He relays that due to COVID delays, there will be a delay until next Spring to finish some of the combined project.

Motion made by Dan Watkins to ratify previous decisions after Solicitor updates and review; 2nd by Laura Baker; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

ENGINEER: John Golanoski

⇒ Bids were received for the 2020 TIP, attended by Pres. Posey and Mr. Bolton. Hammaker East has best price with \$49,357 for the proposed improvements. Work to be completed by September 1, 2020.

Motion made by Dan Watkins to accept bid from Hammaker East for 2020 TIP at \$49,357; 2nd by Frank Anderson; Motion carried, 5 Ayes.

⇒ Mr. Golanoski will be able to Chief Graham with certified tape for speed zone measurements prior to lines being painted on roadway.

ABBOTTSTOWN BOROUGH POLICE DEPT: Chief James Graham

⇒ Presented monthly report; suggested the borough donate to the Wellspan-Gettysburg Hospital Appreciation Event for healthcare workers on the front lines of COVID response. Asking \$150 to provide meals for those working with patients.
